“WIN-WIN” IN FIRST TEST OF SPECIAL LICENSING POLICY

Those living near the Hunters Club in Guildhall Street have been able to benefit from the Special Licensing Policy (championed by Paul and Richard) without preventing the granting of a licence to the club.

As a result of the policy the club will now have to use its rear entrance, so avoiding disturbance to Guildhall Street residents.

Recently Paul and Richard have supported Kings road residents objecting to Deja Vu’s opening to 3.30am at weekends, and have liaised with residents about other licence applications in the area.

PARKING ISSUES

Paul and Richard continue to campaign to get residents’ parking in Kings Road (East) They have also consulted people in both Hospital Road and Shillitoe Close, although only a minority wanted residents’ parking in those particular areas.

MISCELLANEOUS

Paul advised a resident of Mill Road who was threatened with a house being built joining hers. The application has now been withdrawn.

A couple in Out Westgate worried about the new development will now have their fence extended free of charge after Paul and Richard liaised with Havebury Housing.

Harrington Close and surrounding properties have been spared an intrusive car wash proposed on Maynewater Road. Along with local residents, Paul and Richard persuaded the Town Council to object to the application, which was later refused.
